For many years our church, as many other churches do, has had a wreath and candles as part of our recognition of the Advent (meaning *arrival* or *coming*) season, a preparation for the Christmas season, which starts Christmas Day - celebrating Jesus, the Word, coming as a human child; coming to dwell in our hearts; and His soon second coming on earth.

The Advent wreath is not connected with Scripture except as a symbol of biblical truths. We will quote Wikipedia: "Advent wreaths are circular, representing God's infinite love, and are usually made of evergreen leaves, which 'represent the hope of eternal life brought by Jesus Christ.' Within the Advent wreath are candles that generally represent the four weeks of the Advent season as well as 'the light of God coming into the world through the birth of Jesus Christ' although each of the candles can be attributed its own significance as well."

In our version of such interpretation this year, the candles each week specifically symbolize the Christian concepts of hope (week one), peace (week two), joy (week three) and love (week four). Many Advent wreaths (including ours here) also have a white candle in the center to symbolize the arrival of Christmastide, known as the Christ candle. It is lit on Christmas Day.
