That like a shadow, fly all other joys.]

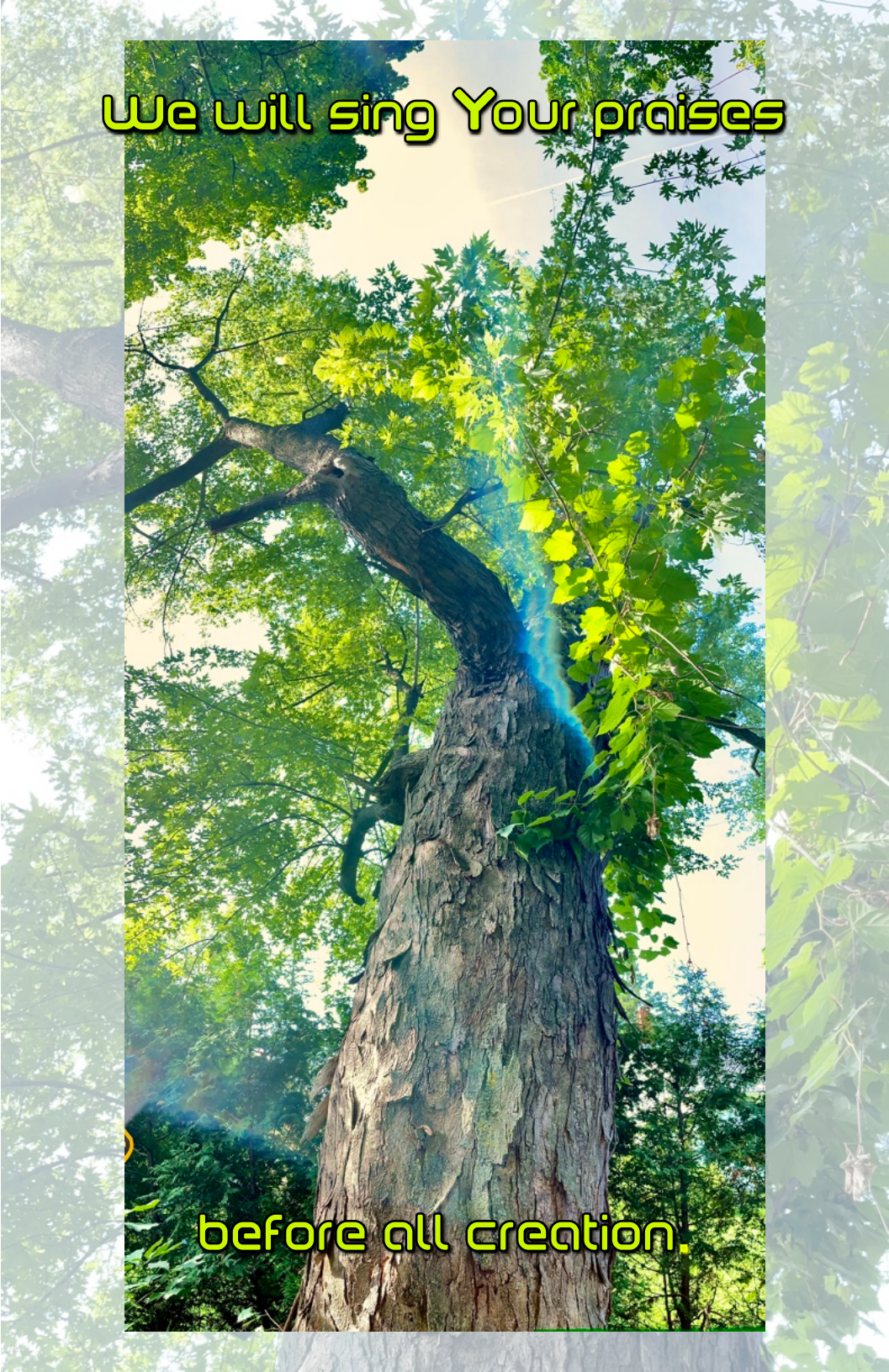

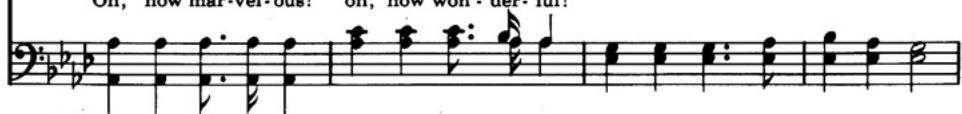

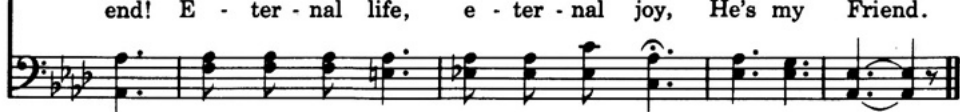
